Provincial ADHD Clinic at BC Children's Hospital, Healthy Minds Centre

The B.C. Provincial ADHD Clinic is part of the Outpatient Psychiatry Department at B.C. Children's Hospital. We are a multidisciplinary clinic, providing assessment and short-term treatment for children with ADHD aged 6-18 years old with complex presentations from across the province. We provide assessment and diagnostic clarification, treatment recommendations, education and support, team-to-team consultation, parent support group, and short-term individual or group intervention as appropriate. The team consists of psychiatry, psychology, social work, occupational therapy, and other allied health professionals. Referrals are made by pediatricians to the Outpatient Psychiatry Department.

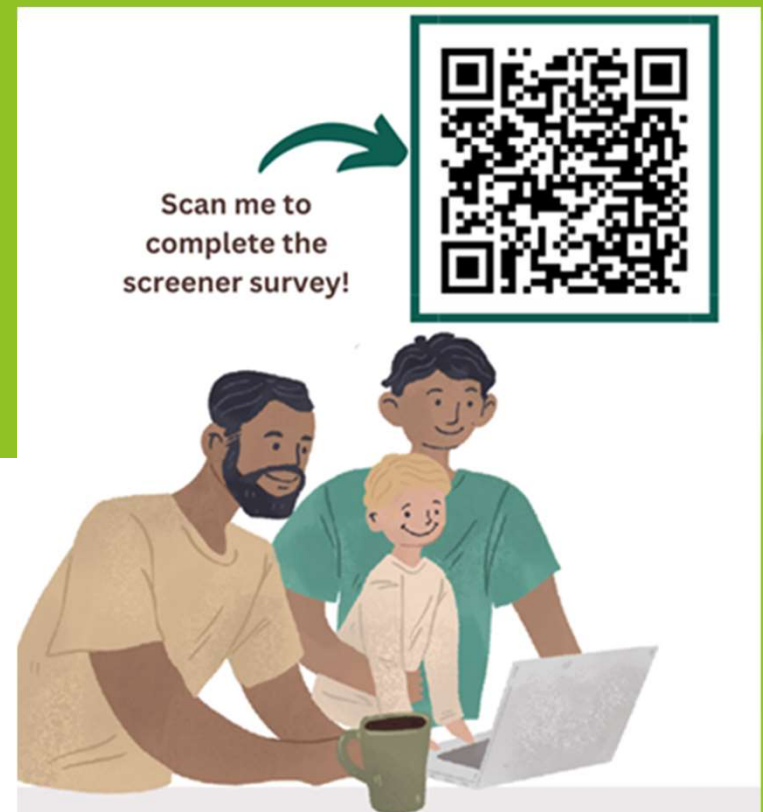

The BC Children's Kelty Mental Health Resource Centre provides mental health and substance use information, resources, and personalized peer support to parents and caregivers from across B.C.

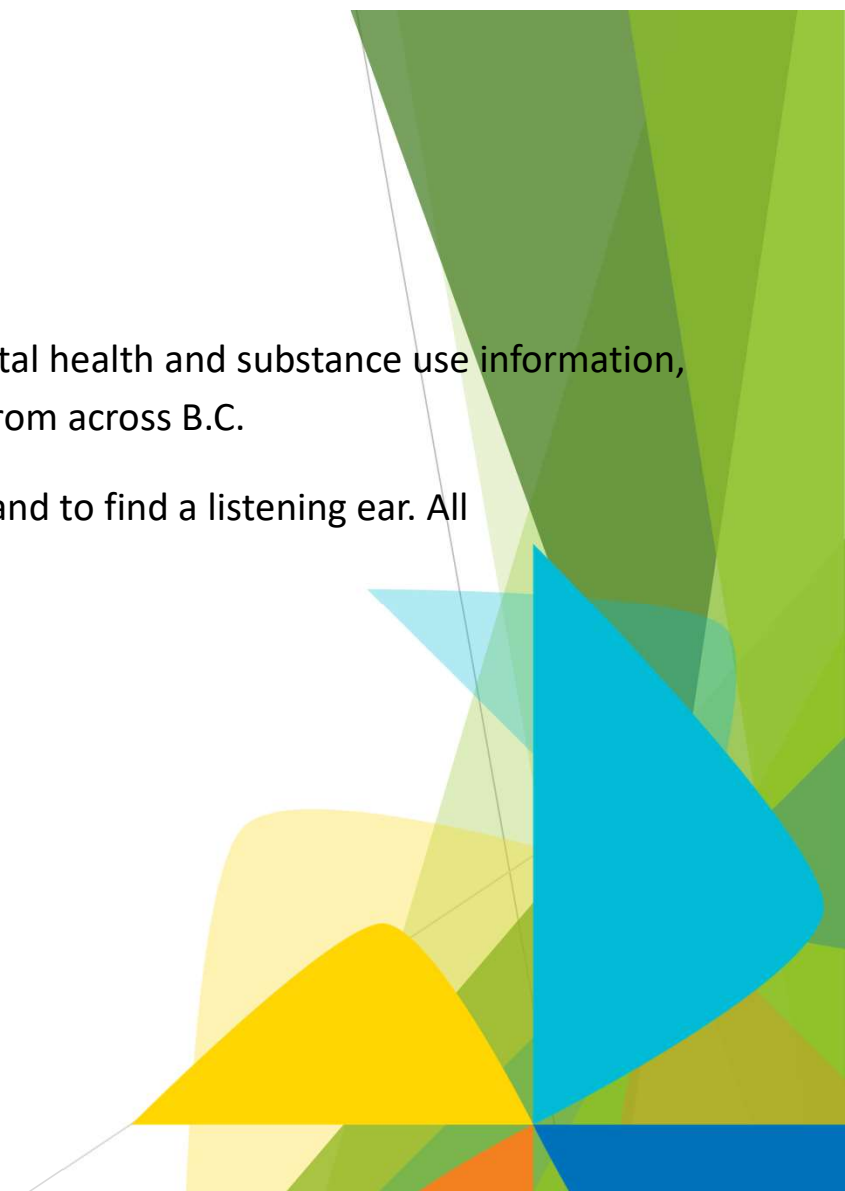

Who We Are

The Ministry of Children and Family Development's **Child and Youth Mental Health (CYMH)** teams located across B.C. provide a range of mental health assessment and treatment options for children and youth (0-18 years of age) and their families at no cost. Our clinics are staffed by mental health clinicians, psychologists, and psychiatrists.

8-Week Parent Psychoeducation Program

A mixture of education, discussion, videos, and practice is presented for 2 hours a week for 8-weeks to parents (virtual).

Community Workshops

ADHD information sessions are held regularly across the city of Vancouver and are open to all community members- including parents, teachers, health providers, and other service professionals.

School-Based Supports

Educational workshops are available to Vancouver school staff upon request.

- *Consent is required if making a referral on behalf of a family.*

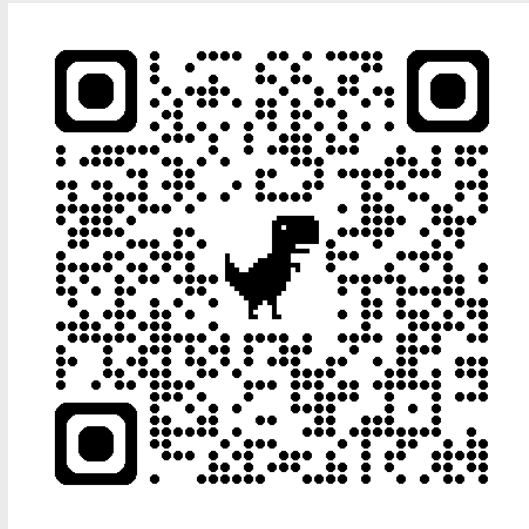

Foundry British Columbia



Foundry provides a range of free and confidential services for youth aged 12-24 and their families in British Columbia, including mental health care, substance use services, physical and sexual health care, and social services. Services are available in person at local centres or virtually through the [Foundry BC app](#), and include both in-person and virtual support such as counselling, peer support, and workshops.

Key services:

- **Mental health care:** Individualized support for mental health, including counselling.
- **Substance use services:** Support for substance use issues.
- **Physical and sexual health care:** Services like STI testing, birth control, and general medical care through its primary care clinics.
- **Social services:** Assistance with social support needs.
- **Youth and family peer support:** Support from peers who have lived experience.
- **Employment and education:** Programs to help youth with employment and education goals.
- **Family services:** Support for families and caregivers.

FamilySmart Parent Peer Support

Family Peer Support Workers help children and young people by helping their family and other caring adults.

What we can do:

- Provide emotional support, as a family who has been there.
- Provide a safe space for a parent to talk about what it's like for them.
- Provide information and resources that are personalized to their family
- Help parents understand and navigate services available to them
- Attend care team or planning meetings to listen, support and debrief with parents

“The Shift”

- Multimodal ADHD Treatment: Medical, environmental, interpersonal – optimizations
- Crucial to understand what ADHD really is and what challenges ADHD poses in daily living situations
- ADHD parent/teacher/coach education resources → Kelty Mental Health (Rolling with ADHD, etc.)
- “The Shift” – adjust parenting/teaching /coaching. Sounds easy but it is not → ADHD coach, BCBA, ADHD Parent/Caregiver Support Group, Mars PC
- It is estimated that those with ADHD receive 20,000 more negative messages by age 10 than those without the condition.
